

<u>Newsletter</u>

We produce a fortnightly newsletter at Ōpoutere School. In the 2025 year, the newsletter will be distributed via email, every second Friday, hard copies will be available from the school office, a downloadable copy will also be available through the school website and HERO. Newsletters are one place where we celebrate learning, sporting achievements, events, share up-coming events and important dates, as well as feature our top school award winners each week.

Class Newsletters

Teachers will sometimes send notices and permission slips home with children when trips and events pertaining to their classes. However, most correspondence will be communicated through our online school system app HERO. These notices often have important information so please check your child's bag regularly or even better get your child into a routine where they hand the notice to you when they get home. 
Finances

Our school system HERO is up and running and we are primarily using this platform for a multitude of parent interactions. You will be able to send your child absentees through this system, access newsletters, receive school messages, reminders and upcoming events, view invoices and eventually track tamariki testing results. If your children catch the bus, your invoices will have been emailed out to you via HERO. Please check your emails and junk mail for these as there is a new set up required to view your invoices and gain access to HERO. You will receive an email giving you prompts to set up a profile or renew your password – you will not have set up a password yet, but please follow the prompts to set up your HERO account and hopefully you will be able to begin navigating your way around. Please contact the office if you have not received an invoice and require assistance. We are happy to email these out to you or send home a hard copy upon request.



<u>Absentee i sm</u>

The Ministry of Education Regulations require all absences must be satisfactorily explained. Please phone, email or submit your HERO absentee notification by <u>9:15am</u> if your child will not be at school and the reason why. We would ask that, where possible, parents avoid taking their children out of school during school hours, as this can be very disruptive to your child's schooling. We do understand that it is not always possible to make doctor or dentist appointments after school but ask that you do so where possible. Non communication with school in regards to absenteeism will be recorded as Truant.



Please inform the school promptly of any changes in your address, landline number/ mobile number address and email address. We must be able to contact you or a trusted caregiver or emergency contact in case of an accident or illness.



Stationery

At Ōpoutere School, the Board of Trustees cover the initial cost of stationary for your child. Any extra stationary that is needed throughout the year will be added to your account at cost price.

School Bus Fees



The Ministry of Education will not fund children's bus travel when families choose to send their child(ren) to a school other than the nearest appropriate one. The Board of Trustees continues to subsidise the cost of bus travel to help minimise this cost.

Individual \$65 per term. (7.00/ week or \$1.20 return trip per day)

Family \$120 per term. (\$ 11.50/ week or \$2.60 return trip per family)

Casual bus users (in zone children and irregular users) \$2.50 each way

We require all bus accounts to be prepaid at the beginning of each term and a request for payment will inform you of the amount of the bus fee still owed. Bus fees are **compulsory** if your child or children catch the bus unless they live within the designated distance from their nearest appropriate school. The current distance is:

Students from Years 1 – 8 must live at least 3.2km from their nearest appropriate school entitlement zone.

Payment made via internet banking or in person to the office. Options are also available to set up an A/P to spread this cost over the year. You will find a bus timetable in your Enrolment Pack.

Bus changes:

Should your child/children be getting off the bus at a stop other than the usual, or you wish your child/children not to go on the bus for any reason, **the school <u>must</u> be notified**, otherwise we will instruct the driver to let your child/children off at their regular stop. If your child is being picked up by another adult, we must be informed of the change in writing or by phone. We will not accept children verbally telling us that their bus arrangements have changed, as sometimes they get the wrong message. Please phone or email the school **before lunch begins at 12.50PM** to notify us of any changes.

Bus Behaviour and Rules

At Ōpoutere School Bus Code of Conduct specific to bus travel given to all children who travel on the bus at the beginning of the year.

Opoutere School Bus Code of Conduct I will:

- Sit quietly in my seat.
- Put my bag on the floor at my feet.
- Stay in my seat while the bus is moving.
- Wait until the bus is stopped before I leave my seat.
- Walk sensibly from the bus when I get off.

I will not:

- Throw anything out of the bus.
- Eat or drink on the bus.
- Distract the driver while the bus is moving.
- Be disruptive or annoying to other passengers.



Donation Scheme

Ōpoutere School has opted into the Donations Scheme. What this means for you as parents is that the board of trustees cannot ask you to donate unless it is for an overnight school/kura camp – and then you can choose if you want to pay none, some or the entire donation. If you choose not to donate, your child cannot be stopped from attending a camp if it is part of the school's core learning programme (curriculum).

- Bus fees will still need to be paid by parents
- Visiting Tech fees will be covered by the school
- Stationery will initially be covered by Ōpoutere School BOT, with minimal charges through the year for extra stationery that may be required.
- You cannot be asked to make either a general or specific donation e.g., a donation for a day trip to a museum or a field trip to a hiking track.

Further information can be requested from the school.

Te Reo Māori me Ōna Tikanga

All children receive some instruction in Te Reo Māori. The focus of this programme is beginner Te Reo and basic tikanga. This is a compulsory part of the school programme. Ōpoutere School has two kapa haka groups, both senior (Tane Mahuta) and junior (Puāwai) Tane Mahuta is optional for year 5-8 tamariki and it requires a level of commitment from the children in the senior group. Puawai is compulsory for all our junior children both support the use of te reo māori me ōna tikanga.



<u>Behaviour</u>

Many of the children in the school behave very well and we are proud of the way they play together and respect their peers, teachers, school, and visitors. The behaviour we have is relative to the vigilance of the staff and the expectations of parents. It is essential to have a school environment that creates a culture of care where children feel secure to learn. All members of Ōpoutere School are entitled to belong to a learning community that fosters an intrinsic approach to behaviour management through the creation of a safe physical and emotional environment. Kotahitanga - Our behaviour management belief is to develop strong relationships with our students, be responsive to needs and manage behaviour through restorative practices.



Swimming

Swimming is an integral part of the Physical Education programme, and all children are required to take part in Term 1 and the latter half of Term 4. If, for any reason, your child/children cannot swim on any given day or time, a note or a phone call is essential. Children need suitable togs and a towel, both of which should be named and in a suitable bag. We cannot allow children to wear cotton t-shirts in the pool as they draw chlorine from the water and make it difficult to keep the water quality safe. Rash shirts, wet suits and other items designed specifically for swimming are permissible. Supplying your child with sun block is advisable.



<u>Clothing</u>

Please ensure your child dresses appropriately for school. No high heels or midriffs showing. Clothing should be suitable for daily fitness. **PLEASE NAME ALL YOUR CHILDREN'S CLOTHING**. At times through the term, lost property will be available at Monday morning assemblies. All unclaimed clothing will be given to the Opportunity Shop at the end of each term.

<u>Sun Safety</u>

All students must be sun safe. In Terms 1 and 4, students *must* eat their lunch under the shaded areas provided (i.e., the Wharekai or under the shade sails) and must wear hats in the playground. Sun hats are worn during any school event or class excursion during the terms mentioned. We encourage parents to apply sunscreen before school. Sun Cream is available at school also. If you wish for your child to not use our school suncream, please advise and provide your own to your child's teacher.



<u>Valuables</u>

We ask that children do not bring valuable toys or other items to school, as we cannot ensure the safety of these items. The use of mobile phones is prohibited at school. Any children who bring a phone to school should hand it to their class teacher and collect it after school.

Visiting Tech

Technology for Year 7 and Year 8 children is at the Whangamatā Area School on Wednesday mid morning, Beginning week 2. Children are to wear closed shoes when in the workshop and cooking room without these they cannot go. Transport to and from visiting tech is provided.

Adventure Learning

This is an exciting and unique part of Ōpoutere School curriculum. Adventure learning looks to develop the following core values; Adventure, Environment, Leadership, Service, Excellence and Tikanga/ Te Reo. Students in each class explore the following themes throughout the year:

Term 1: Te Moana / The Ocean

Kayaking / Conservation / Environmental Studies / Marine Science / Water Safety



Term 2: Matariki / Māori New Year

Tikanga / Te Reo / Astronomy / Leadership / Māori Games & Art / Gardening / Service




Term 3: Te Whakataetae / Adventure Racing

(Literal translation – competition)

Navigation / Teamwork / Fitness / Leadership / Strategy / Maths / Bushcraft / Survival



Term 4: Te Haerenga / Expedition



Safety / Risk Management / Planning / Teamwork / Leadership / Geography

All students participate at their level. Safety is paramount and EOTC guidelines adhered to when managing these activities. A blanket consent and medical form is sent home at the start of the year to cover day trips. Overnight trips, require separate parent consent and police vetting notices will come home informing parents of gear children may need and on what days. Other notices will come home informing parents of gear children may need and on what days.
